Digi Yatra - India's Domestic Air Travel App

Digi Yatra is an app that helps air passengers to obtain security clearance and navigate quickly in Indian airports, from entry to boarding the aircraft, using a contactless facial recognition technology. It was launched in 2022 in three airports in India, viz., New Delhi, Bangalore and Varanasi. It is owned and managed by Digi Yatra Foundation and is a part of India's successful Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI). At the moment it is available for domestic flights only and is operational at over 20 airports. Currently it has nine million active users and has facilitated more than 45 million journeys.

Namibia Prepares to Roll Out National Digital ID System

Namibia is finalizing preparations for the launch of its national digital identity system, part of a broader effort to enhance access to services and strengthen digital governance. The project is being led by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security (MHAISS) in collaboration with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and other development partners. Namibia will become the first country to implement the Model Governance Framework for Digital Legal Identity, introduced by UNDP in 2023.
