One Health: A Collaborative Approach to Global Health

The One Health strategy acknowledges the interdependence between human, animal, and environmental health and recommends concerted action in preventing and controlling zoonoses.

The framework seeks to establish robust health systems by bringing together healthcare professionals, veterinarians, ecologists, and policy-makers that will be able to respond effectively to new health hazards. International organizations like the World Health Organization (WHO), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), and the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) have also emphasized its use to counteract the increasing challenges of zoonotic diseases, antimicrobial resistance, and environmental degradation.





During a discussion between Agriculture Cabinet Secretary Mutahi Kagwe and UAE Ambassador Dr. Salim Ibrahim Alnaqbi at the UAE Embassy in Nairobi, the two countries pledged to enhance bilateral relations on the backdrop of recent agreements aimed at boosting trade and investment. In January this year, Kenya and the UAE signed the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), which eliminated trade barriers and opened new markets for Kenyan exports, including meat, fruits, vegetables, and flowers.
