South Korean enterprises show interest in developing green agriculture in Vietnam

Each year, Vietnam's agricultural sector uses around 10 million tonnes of fertiliser to boost crop productivity, meeting both domestic consumption and export demands. However, many experts have warned that the overuse of chemical fertilisers can lead to serious environmental and soil quality problems, posing risks to the sustainable growth of the agricultural sector. Excessive use of inorganic fertilisers causes soil degradation and contributes to environmental pollution. As a result, the use of organic fertilisers has become a rising trend and is actively encouraged by regulatory authorities.

Ghana and Singapore Unite to Launch Africa's First 'Finternet' for Inclusive Digital Finance

Ghana's District Assemblies Common Fund (DACF) and Singapore's Embed Financial Group Holdings (EFGH) have announced a joint venture to create Africa's first Finternet – a digital financial infrastructure linking governments, communities and businesses through transparent, self-sustaining technology. The Finternet will connect payments, credit and insurance the way the Internet connects information, enabling districts across Ghana to manage funds and services more efficiently while creating new revenue streams for national development. Under the joint venture, the DACF and EFGH will co-invest in projects that generate income for public initiatives and support local SMEs. Each initiative will operate as a public–private partnership, ensuring that revenues are shared, local jobs are created and funds flow back into Ghana's development priorities.



FAO and RUFORUM renew partnership for agricultural education & innovation in Africa

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and the Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM) have renewed their partnership through the signing of a new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) during a virtual ceremony attended by senior officials from both institutions. The renewed five-year collaboration reaffirms FAO and RUFORUM's shared commitment to advancing higher agricultural education, research, and innovation across Africa to accelerate the transformation of agrifood systems. The partnership aims to strengthen institutional and technical capacities, promote knowledge exchange, and foster innovation for sustainable and climate-resilient food systems.

Kazakhstan and Croatia Expand Cooperation in the Field of Healthcare

Indonesia-Palestine Cooperation in Agriculture


Indonesia's support for the Palestinian people is taking concrete form with the government preparing up to 15,000 hectares of land for agricultural investment in North Kalimantan. Agriculture Minister Andi Amran Sulaiman confirmed the initiative following a meeting with Palestinian Ambassador to Indonesia Zuhair Al-Shun in Jakarta. The land will be developed into an integrated agricultural zone featuring plantations, livestock farming, and agro-industrial operations. The project will be managed through collaboration between state-owned enterprises (BUMN), the private sector, and international policy partners.

Ukraine and Azerbaijan to ink new healthcare cooperation agreement

Ukraine and Azerbaijan are expanding their cooperation in the healthcare sector by implementing a joint action plan to exchange knowledge, train personnel, and establish horizontal partnerships between healthcare institutions. Tomorrow, Ukraine and Azerbaijan will sign a new bilateral agreement to further enhance this collaboration," Ukrainian Minister of Health Viktor Liashko. According to Minister Liashko, the new document envisions organizing familiarization and business visits for doctors, conducting joint surgeries, training rehabilitation teams, and holding seminars with expert participation. The minister noted that the agreement also provides for the development of cooperation in healthcare, medical science, and education through several key initiatives, including joint projects, scientific research, academic and student exchanges, dual diploma programs, and joint training of personnel.



AMEXCID Visits Guatemala to Strengthen Education and Agriculture

The Mexican Agency for International Development Cooperation (AMEXCID) conducted a working visit to Guatemala to strengthen bilateral cooperation and coordinate initiatives in education, agriculture, environment, and social development as part of a shared regional prosperity agenda. During the visit, AMEXCID Executive Director Alejandra Del Moral Vela signed a Joint Declaration on International Cooperation with Guatemala's Ministry of Foreign Affairs to implement the second phase of the Sembrando Vida program and deepen strategic collaboration. The agreement aims to advance sustainable development, social inclusion, and institutional strengthening initiatives. This agreement reaffirms our joint commitment to promoting sustainable development, social well-being, and shared prosperity, said Del Moral Vela.

Uganda to Establish Halal Certification Office to Strengthen Access to Gulf Markets

Uganda is stepping up efforts to boost its agricultural exports to Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries. To that end, it is partnering with the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) to establish a National Halal Certification Office, ChimpReports reported on Tuesday. According to Ramathan Ggoobi, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Finance, the project is already at an advanced stage. He made the announcement during the Uganda-UAE Business Forum held in Kampala. Halal certification ensures that products comply with Islamic dietary standards, a prerequisite in many Muslim-majority markets. Once operational, the new office will work with the Ministry of Trade to implement halal protocols across critical parts of the export chain, including agri-industrial parks, cold storage facilities, and key logistics hubs such as Entebbe International Airport and the Hoima Cargo Terminal.



Agriculture remains strategic priority for both Bulgaria and Azerbaijan



The agreement includes exchanging university professors and students, holding joint congresses and specialized conferences, and boosting ties between Iranian and Saudi medical universities.

It reinforces the longstanding partnership between the AU and the Global Fund in alignment with the AU Catalytic Framework to End AIDS, TB and Eliminate Malaria in Africa by 2030, African Health Strategy 2030 and the newly adopted African Union Roadmap to 2030 & Beyond: Sustaining the AIDS Response, Ensuring Systems Strengthening and Health Security for the Development of Africa.
