The occurrences of natural disasters are a frequent phenomenon and have imprinted their devastating effects in various corners of the world. Developing blueprints for disaster risk management and contingency planning, thus, assumes importance in this regard. In the aftermath of any natural disaster, a nation depends on the assistance of the first responders which may constitute its emergency assistance office. Further, the international community plays a pivotal role in extending assistance in the form of aid, manpower, equipment, etc. to provide support to the affected nation/region. Systemically, the developing countries, owing to their lack of resources and funding to protect themselves remain at peril from the consequences of natural disasters. Thus, to an extent, they remain dependent on external assistance from other nations and other international organizations.

Operation Brahma - India Acts as a First Responder Quake-Hit Myanmar

India delivered a fresh tranche of 50 tonnes of relief materials to Myanmar to help victims of the 7.7-magnitude earthquake that killed over 2,000 people and injured 3,900. The relief materials were taken to the Myanmarese city of Yangon by two Indian Navy ships -- INS Satpura and INS Savitri. Three more Indian Navy ships -- INS Karmukh, INS Gharial and LCU-52 -- are enroute to Yangon with over 500 tonnes of additional aid material, officials said.


