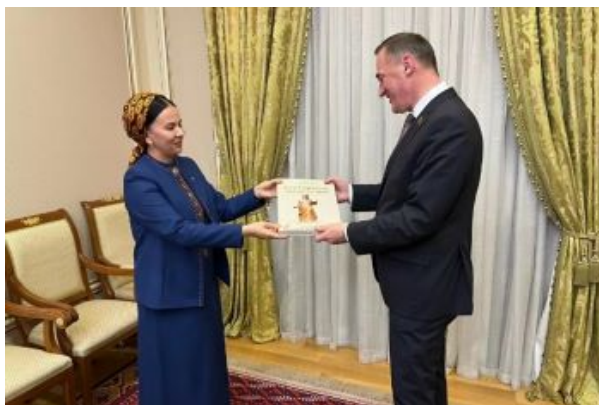


Disruption burden falls heaviest on the Global South

Companies in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA), the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) and the Gulf (GCC) lose over a month of operational time every year due to logistics disruption, more than their peers in Europe and North America, according to DP World's Without Logistics Global Report, published on 8 January. Companies in the GCC and 43% in MENA report annual disruption costs of one million dollars or more. These regions also report the world's highest levels of customer complaints, lost contracts and reputational damage caused by supply chain failure. The report adds that companies in parts of the Global South are losing months of productivity, millions of dollars and long-term customer trust as supply chain disruption shifts from episodic shock to a defining feature of today's operating environment. Without Logistics is based on a global study of 680 senior logistics and supply chain decision-makers across eight industries and nine regions. It found that while disruption is now commonplace, its impact is deeply uneven, with firms in SSA, MENA and GCC experiencing the longest downtime, the highest costs and the most severe customer fallout. The study shows that 83% of firms in SSA, 72% in MENA, and 61% in the GCC lose more than a month of operational time in years when there is major logistics disruption, as against 50% of firms in North America, 41% in Germany and 36% in the UK.

FAO Launches Regional FMD Emergency Project in Iraq with National FMD Laboratory Diagnosis Techniques Training Workshop

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), in close collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture of Iraq (MoA) and the Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources of the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (MoAWR-KRI), has officially launched the regional Technical Cooperation project “Emergency control of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (FMD) outbreaks in Iraq and Syria and prevention of its transmission to Lebanon and Jordan”. The project officially kicked off in Erbil in the

presence of the Technical Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Dr Mithaq Al Khafaji, FAO Representative in Iraq, Salah El-Hajj Hassan, and representative of Ministry of Agriculture and Water resources -KRG, through the launch of a five-day workshop about “FMD Laboratory Diagnostic Techniques with a Specific Focus on the SAT-1 Serotype,” bringing together veterinary laboratory specialists from across Iraq.

Chile and India advance agricultural partnership with joint horticulture plan

Chile and India have reached a new milestone in bilateral agricultural cooperation by formalising a strategic agreement on technical and scientific collaboration in horticulture. The partnership reflects the growing importance of knowledge exchange and innovation in strengthening food security and sustainable agriculture. The cooperation is based on a Joint Action Plan for 2025–2027 signed by the Agricultural Research Institute (INIA) of Chile and the Indian Council of Agricultural Research

(ICAR). The document transforms years of expert-level dialogue into a practical framework for joint research, innovation and the development of horticultural production.

Uruguay assumes G77+China presidency

Uruguay assumes as of this Wednesday the presidency of the Group of 77 and China (G77+China), a group that unites 134 developing countries at the United Nations (UN) headquarters in New York. Foreign Minister Mario Lubetkin is here to assume the presidency on behalf of his country. The G77 presidency rotates on a regional basis each year, and this time it is Latin America and the Caribbean's turn, with Uruguay serving as coordinator and spokesperson. According to its official definition, the Group "provides the means so that countries of the Global South articulate and promote their collective economic interests and enhance their joint negotiating capacity." In particular, it addresses important international economic issues within the UN system and promotes South-South cooperation for development.
